ECONOMIC ARCHAEOLOGY AND THE LESSONS IT HAS FOR US TODAY

Justin is an investment manager and business commentator and one of the best known and most trusted financial commentators in the UK, appearing across the board on radio, television and in newspapers. He was the host of the television series Investor Questor and fronted his own show on LBC radio. His most recent column was Mr Moneymaker in the Daily Mail.

Having trained as a barrister, Justin started his career in Barclays DCO and was posted to Uganda, where he was seriously wounded in an incident that nearly put an end to his career. He subsequently took on a corporate banking role in Singapore. In 2019 he was awarded an honorary doctorate by Southampton University, which also created the Justin Urquhart-Stewart bursary, an award available to second year business students. In 2016, he helped to launch Investors in the Community.

Justin was the co-founder of 7 Investment Management in 2001, building it up to £15 billion funds under management before his retirement in 2019. He is now the chairman and co-founder of Regionally, innovating new investment services to the regions. Previously, he founded Broker Services, which became Barclays Stockbrokers and was a co-founder of what was to become the AIM market, as well as setting up the investment education specialist Proshare.

Chris is currently the first Chair of the Chartered Institute of Legal Executives (CILEX) and the first non-lawyer to lead a legal professional body in England and Wales. He is Dean Emeritus, Henley Business School, and former Senior Executive at Diageo and Cadburys. Chris is also an Emeritus Professor at Manchester University.

He won the Management Book of the Year Prize in 2012 for his analysis of leadership in business in relation to the financial crisis: The Cult of the Leader. He was appointed to the Expert Panel of the Criminal Legal Aid Review in 2021 and is now a member of the Criminal Legal Aid Advisory Board.

WHY GOOD LEADERSHIP MAKES THE DIFFERENCE WITH GENERAL SIR GORDON MESSENGER KCB DSO OBE ADC

General Sir Gordon Messenger served as a Royal Marine from 1983 to 2019, in a career that spanned operational command, capability development, public communications and the strategic leadership of Defence. His career was notable for two reasons: he was the first Royal Marine to be promoted to 4-star rank for 50 years, and the first member of the naval service since the Korean War to receive a Bar to the Distinguished Service Order.

His operational tours include Kosovo, Iraq, Lebanon and Afghanistan, culminating in command of 3 Commando Brigade in Helmand from 2008 to 2009. He was appointed Vice Chief of Defence Staff in May 2016, acting as the Chief of Defence Staff's principal deputy for operational matters and leading on the management and oversight of military capability, including nuclear and cyber issues. Since retiring in October 2019, he has established a portfolio career. In Oct 2021, he was commissioned by the Government to lead a Review into leadership and management in the Health and Social Care sectors, which reported successfully in June 2022. He was installed as His Majesty's Constable of the Tower of London in October 2022, a role which includes trusteeships of Royal Historic Palaces and the Royal Armouries.
