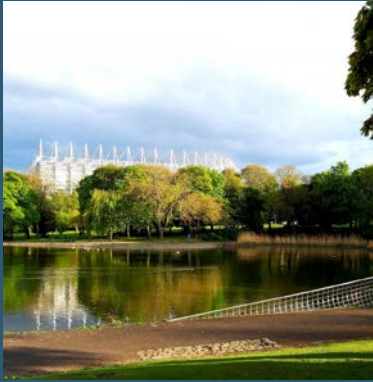




A dog-friendly visit

Newcastle is a 'terrwoofic' city break for people who would like to get away for a long-weekend to explore a new city with their dog. Newcastle was even rated as the number one UK city for dog-friendly visits in a recent survey.





Leazes Park - NE2 4BJ

Leazes Park is Newcastle city centre's oldest park with a tranquil lake and a great place to escape the hustle and bustle of city life. Only a **2 minute walk** from our Hotel, Leazes Park is the oldest green space in Newcastle and has been restored to its former glory. This traditional Victorian park also features 6 tennis and Basketball courts (open for play at all times) and a large play area in the woodland suitable for children of all ages.



Quayside - NE1 3DE

Newcastle's Quayside has been a hub of activity for centuries, and the backbone of Newcastle's rich maritime history. Today, it continues to be a bustling and vibrant district that attracts visitors from all over the world. The Quayside is a **20 minute walk** from our hotel and offers a unique glimpse into Newcastle's industrial past, with iconic landmarks such as the Tyne Bridge and the Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art standing as testaments to the city's enduring heritage.



Exhibition Park - NE2 4PZ

The park has a stunning mix of tree-lined paths, large informal lawned areas, beautiful flowerbeds and a stunning lake that is home to a family of swans and ducks.

Exhibition Park is **less than 30 minutes walk** from our hotel has something for everyone with a popular play area, large open spaces for ball games or a relaxing picnic, a large skatepark and outdoor gym equipment. The network of footpaths and cycle paths.



Jesmond Dene - NE7 7DZ

A peaceful haven for visitors, residents and furry friends alike. Stretching over three kilometres, you'll find a network of paths and bridges along with a mix of native and exotic trees. Enjoy a forest walk alongside the river with a picturesque 14th century water mill and waterfall. Grab a coffee and a bite to eat at the Visitor Centre and spot a few furry friends at Pets corner! It's easy to forget you're in the midst of the hustle and bustle of the city.



Tynemouth - NE30 4BZ

Tynemouth boasts some of the most breathtaking views and historical landmarks in the region. Walk along the beautiful coast line and down the Tynemouth High street, which is dotted with great independent shops and a variety of cafes and pubs.

The ruins of Tynemouth Priory stand tall to this day offering clifftop views of the rolling North Sea. Please note, some beaches don't allow dogs on in the summer months.



Land of Oak and Iron - NE21 6RU

Encompassing a vast 177 square miles of the Derwent Valley and its environs, the Land of Oak & Iron is a region of unparalleled beauty and historical significance. Creating a breath-taking mosaic of woodlands, riverbanks, and grasslands that provide a haven for wildlife. At the heart of the site lies the Heritage Centre in Winlaton Mill, home to a charming café (also dog-friendly) and shop, serving up the best of the region's local produce.



Saltwell Park - NE9 5AX

Nestled in the heart of Gateshead, Saltwell Park is one of Britain's finest examples of a Victorian heritage. A perfect dog-friendly free park with over 55 acres to explore.

Relax and unwind in the beautiful green space; including play areas, boating lake, a maze and pets' corner; get active with walking and jogging routes or simply enjoy lunch and a hot drink in the stunning surroundings of Saltwell Towers.



Durham Riverside - DH1 3UW

A captivating city with winding cobbled streets and a prominent peninsula crowned with the dramatic Durham Cathedral and Castle.

Explore the timeless quality of this quintessential old English University City, take some time out with a relaxing riverside walk or river cruise, or soak up the atmosphere with superb cafés, artisan workshops, boutiques, galleries and museums.



Rising Sun Country Park - NE12 9SS

A green oasis of 162 hectares, set in the heart of North Tyneside. Boasting a nature reserve with ponds, woodlands and extensive grasslands; a community farm and Countryside Centre, the site is a haven for wildlife and an ideal place to walk and enjoy the great outdoors.

The park has lots of easy walking routes which are all very well signposted with maps available from the centre. The Visitor Centre is the main hub of the country park with a play area and cafe.
