# **Local Transportation**

Known locally as the "T" Boston's subway system is the most effective way to get around the City of Boston, as well as its surrounding neighborhood

There are 5 lines that run to different neighborhoods around Boston into the downtown area; each is designated by a color:

#### Red Line:

Cambridge/South Shore Quincy, MA

Blue line:

East Boston, Airport, North Shore Revere, MA

#### Green line\*:

Allston/Newton/Brookline/Mission Hill Northeastern University

The Green line has 4 separate Branches:

B: Boston College/Allston/Brighton/BU

C: Brookline/Cleveland Circle

D: Riverside/Longwood medical/Newton

E: Heath Street/Northeastern/MFA/Mission Hill

### **Orange Line:**

Chinatown/Medford/Somerville

Silver line:

Airport/Seaport District/South Station

## Closest "T" Stops:

The Blue Line "Aquarium" Station is the closest to the Harborside Inn, right outside our front door. If you need any of the other three lines you can take the Blue line to

**State Street Station for the Orange Line** 

Government Center for the Green Line

Or

From government center take the Green Line one stop to Park St Station to jump on the Red line.

The silver line runs from South Station on the Red Line

## **Ticket Information:**

If you do not exit the station, you only pay ONE fare to access any of the 5 lines

T Fare:

Adults \$2.40 - one-way

Children under 11 yrs FREE

To purchase T fares, you must by a "Charlie Ticket" which holds a dollar amount. You can Purchase these at kiosks at located at any underground station. There are MBTA employees ready to assist if necessary

\*If you are headed to Fenway Park (Kenmore Station) or Hynes Convention Center take any branch except for the E. It divides after Copley station up Huntington Ave.

\*The Majority of Green line stops particularly after Kenmore Station are above ground & do not have the Charlie Ticket Kiosks, so make sure you purchase an amount sufficient to cover your return trip to the Hotel.
