




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WELCOME TO THE NEW FISHWRAPPER

One boat, two northern shores



One visit to Minnesota's North Shore and the similarities to our country's northernmost state quickly become apparent. Alaska, like our Lake Superior, boasts rocky coasts, white-capped waves and remote tracts of wilderness. With these rich geographic similarities, it only makes sense that commercial likenesses might follow.

Though the daily catch of Tofte's commercial herring fisherman was quite different than the bigger ocean fish reeled in by Alaskan anglers, the boats used in both regions appear quite alike today. "There has long been an exchange of information between fishermen of the North Shore and Alaska," says Todd Miller, who spoke to the Tofte Historical Society Annual Meeting on May 1, 2011. "Considering the similar terrain and heritages, it's not surprising that fishermen in both regions have come to similar conclusions about what makes a good boat." For fishermen here and further North, "the flared sides of [these boats] are important when hauling in heavy loads over the side of the boat," says Miller. "The semi flatbottomed design is ideal for dragging the boat onto the shore or on skids, something that used to be important on the North Shore and is still important in Alaska where there are few marine facilities."

Only twenty-five miles from Bluefin Bay's doorstep, visitors can view two boats that reflect this unique design. Moored in Grand Marais' harbor, Harley Toftey's aluminum commercial fishing boat is reminiscent of Alaskan fishing boats. At the Grand Marais Boathouse, Todd Miller is building a similarly modeled 24-foot "Tolman Alaskan Skiff" to troll the shores of Lake Superior.

A closer look at how Bluefin Bay has gone green

Here are just a few of the ways we're reducing our impact on the environment while strengthening your experience on the shore:

• Geothermal heat recovery systems for both our indoor and outdoor pools, saving over 22,000 gallons of propane per year

Take a leisurely stroll along our lakewalk to Tofte Town Park & Boat Launch, which recently added new lake viewing areas and offers the perfect stop for a picnic lunch, relaxation and wave watching.

Favorite Hike: Along the river to Caribou Falls Recommended by Dennis Rysdahl, General Manager

This moderately difficult hike offers great views of one of the nicest waterfalls on the North Shore. From the wayside rest on Highway 61, hike along the river about 1/3 of a mile. Walk down 160 stairs to the base of the falls, take some time to enjoy the scenery then continue to the top of the falls for breathtaking views of Lake Superior.

Favorite Day Trip: Kelso Loop at Sawbill Lake Recommended by Mark Hutchins, Guest Activities

The Kelso Loop provides all the adventure of a trek through the Boundary Waters Canoe Area

Wilderness in a single afternoon! Visit Sawbill Outfitters to get set up with canoes, paddles, permits, and anything else you need before setting off. The full three lake loop takes about four hours of leisurely paddling.

Favorite Dining Spot: Coho Café & Bakery Recommended Andy Rysdahl, Guest Services
