

GORDON RIVER CRUISES OVERVIEW

BACKGROUND

Gordon River Cruises offers wilderness cruises into the UNESCO Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area. Departing daily from Strahan, we connect people with wilderness that is unique on a world scale and the history of Tasmania's rugged west coast. Our signature experience is the morning Gordon River Cruise. We also offer an Evening Dinner Cruise to see the Gordon River, as well as some shorter tour options.

We operate two vessels for our cruises: Spirit of the Wild and MV Sophia

WHERE?

You'll find us on the west coast of Tasmania, in the beautiful little town of Strahan. Strahan is about 5 hours by car from Hobart or Launceston. From here, we access the pristine wilderness of the Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park, part of the World Heritage Area.

WHY?

Guests cruise with us to experience a natural wonder. To experience a place like nothing else on earth, reflecting on ancient natural history, human history, the qualities of our wilderness and its protection for the future.

GORDON RIVER CRUISE

- 1) Approximately 30 minutes after departing Strahan, you'll reach Hells Gates. We aim to travel through the narrow mouth of the harbour but on occasion, rough seas may not permit. This is the place the convicts referred to as the entrance to 'hell on earth'.
- 2) Passing salmon and ocean trout farms as you travel south from Hells Gates, you will pause for a few minutes and may see the fish being fed.
- 3) The next highlight is entering the Gordon River with *Spirit of the Wild's* signature electric motors quietly taking you into this ancient wilderness. Have your camera ready for this part of the cruise!
- 4) Stroll the boardwalk at Heritage Landing, taking in the sight of ancient Huon pines and other temperate rainforest species. Approximately 30 minutes is spent at Heritage Landing.
- 5) Enjoy a delicious Chef-prepared lunch on the Gordon River, including Tasmanian salmon from the farms you have just cruised by.
- 6) Step ashore at Sarah Island for an outstanding interpretive tour, hosted by guides from the Round Earth Company. Learn about the horrible convict history of this small World Heritage-listed island.
- 7) Return to Strahan on board *Spirit of the Wild*, still living the tales of the day and reflecting on the many thousands of years that have shaped this remarkable place.






Gordon River Cruise (GRC) Land-based activities

DINING ON THE RIVER

The menu on board *Spirit of the Wild* has been carefully planned to showcase some of the best Tasmania has to offer. Prepared daily by the team of Chefs at Strahan Village, the buffet-style lunch on the Main Deck and Premier Upper Deck are a highlight of the cruise.





WHISPER MODE

Spirit of the Wild is equipped with a hybrid diesel-electric propulsion system, allowing us to shut down the diesel engines while on the Gordon River. You'll cruise quietly into the wilderness. To put this in perspective, the noise created by the vessel is less than 45 dba in the Premier Upper Deck – about the same as ambient sounds in a library.

ON BOARD INTERPRETATION

Tasmania's west coast is a place of characters and stories. Throughout a Gordon River Cruise, you'll meet a few of these colourful characters on our interpretive videos; people who have shaped the west coast along the way. These include Captain James Kelly, a convict, Lady Jane Franklin and a grouchy convict guard. These videos aim to support, the majority of our interpretation, which is undertaken by our amazing on-board guides.

THE PILLINGER EXPLORER

- Departure Cruise from Strahan to Pillinger (45 minutes).
- 2. Pillinger Wander around the ruins of the old port of Pillinger on a guided tour (sturdy footwear required)
- 3. Pillinger to Sarah Island (25 minutes)
- 4. Sarah Island Explore the convict ruins of Sarah Island on a guided tour. Enjoy lunch on Sarah Island
- 5. Sarah Island to Hells Gates (30 minutes)
- 6. Pending weather and time availability, your skipper can navigate to and possibly through Hells Gates, the entrance to Macquarie Harbour
- 7. Hells Gates to Strahan (30 Minutes)
- Arrive Strahan

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What does 'Whisper Mode' mean?

A: When Spirit of the Wild enters the Gordon River, she cruises on electric motors, providing a remarkably quiet on-river experience, in keeping with the natural surrounds.

Q: Are you guaranteed to see reflections?

A: Although we see reflections more often than not, we can't guarantee it. Regardless of whether you see reflections on the river, it's a spectacular place.

Q: Can you shorten the cruise?

A: No. We offer charter options, as well as other shorter tours aboard MV Sophia

Q: Do you cater for different dietary requirements?

A: Yes. Please provide any relevant information at the time of booking.

Q: Is there a cost to audio tours and do I need to reserve one in advance?

A: No, there is no additional cost. Please reserve your audio tour at the time of booking.
