Nyepi Day, also known as the “Day of Silence,” is a sacred event in Balinese Hindu culture, marking the New Year in the Hindu lunar calendar. This special day is dedicated to self-reflection, meditation, and spiritual purification.

In 2026, Nyepi falls on Thursday, 19 March, beginning at 06.00 on 19 March and concluding at 06.00 on 20 March. During this time, the entire island of Bali will come to a standstill. Residents and visitors are required to remain indoors, and all outdoor activities are strictly prohibited. The only individuals permitted outside are the Pecalang, traditional Balinese security personnel responsible for maintaining order and ensuring compliance with Nyepi regulations.

IMPORTANT RESTRICTIONS ON NYEPI DAY:

- The airport will be closed to all domestic and international flights.
- No vehicular traffic or public transport will operate.
- Lights must remain off or dimmed at night to preserve the sacred atmosphere.
- Nyepi Preparations & Related Ceremonies
- The days leading up to Nyepi are filled with meaningful rituals that may impact travel and daily activities:



UNDERSTANDING BALINESE DAY OF SILENCE

Nyepi is the first day of the **Balinese Hindu New Year**, observe as a **Day of Silence**. It is based on the Balinese Saka calendar, which reflects Bali's unique perception of time. While the Gregorian calendar is officially used for administrative and modern activities in Indonesia, Balinese cultural and spiritual life continues to follow its own cyclical system of time. This traditional rhythm remains central to religious observances, ceremonial calendars, and the daily spiritual practices of the Balinese people.

Bali measures time using two parallel calendar systems: **the Pawukon** and **the Saka calendars**. Both calendars run alongside each other and mark auspicious and inauspicious days. **The Pawukon calendar** follows a 210-day cycle, divided into thirty seven-day weeks, known as **wuku**. It is further structured through a complex system of overlapping "weeks," called **wewaran**, which can range from one to ten days. The Pawukon calendar governs many aspects of temple ceremonies and family rituals across Bali. Equally significant is the **Saka calendar**, a lunar-solar system that primarily regulates agricultural and major religious observances. The Saka year consists of twelve months, or **sasih**, each lasting between 28 and 30 days, resulting in a total of 354 to 355 days per year. To align the lunar calendar with the solar cycle, days are periodically omitted, and an additional month (**nampih**) is inserted approximately every thirty months.

Unlike New Year celebrations elsewhere, it is spent in complete quiet, fasting, and self-reflection. The entire island comes to a standstill—no travel, no lights, no entertainment—giving both nature and the soul a chance to rest.

According to Balinese Hindu belief, Nyepi is dedicated to the purification of **Bhuana Alit** (the human world) and **Bhuana Agung** (the universe). Observing silence is also meant to trick malevolent spirits into thinking the island is empty, protecting it from harm. This practice shows the deep connection between the physical and spiritual realms in Balinese culture. The absence of noise, light, and movement creates a unique form of celebration—one of reflection, simplicity, and renewal. Over time, Nyepi has become more than a cultural tradition, it is a central part of Balinese identity and spiritual life. The careful rituals before and after the Day of Silence reflect the Balinese people's dedication to preserving their religious and cultural heritage.





THE RITUALS

The days preceding Nyepi are filled with vibrant rituals and ceremonies that prepare both the island and its people for the Day of Silence. Each ritual carries deep spiritual meaning, focusing on purification, protection, and the restoration of balance between the human world (Bhuana Alit) and the cosmic universe (Bhuana Agung). These practices ensure that negative forces are removed and that the community enters the New Year with harmony and renewed spiritual energy.

MELASTI CEREMONY (PURIFICATION)

Held 2–3 days before Nyepi, Melasti is a sacred procession in which Balinese Hindus travel to the sea, rivers, or lakes carrying temple heirlooms and sacred objects. During this ritual, both the temples and the individual participants undergo symbolic purification, cleansing Bhuana Agung (the universe) and Bhuana Alit (the human world). Melasti represents spiritual renewal and prepares the community for the New Year.

You may witness this ceremony at Petitenget Temple near the resort from approximately 09.00 to 14.00. Please note that road closures and heavy traffic congestion are expected during this time.

MECARU (EXORCISM)

The day before Nyepi, the Mecaru ritual is performed to drive away **Bhuta Kala**, or negative energies. Offerings are made at crossroads, temples, and homes, often accompanied by loud noises, chanting, and symbolic gestures. This ritual is intended to cleanse the environment and the community of harmful spiritual influences.

OGOHO-OGOHO PARADE (PENERUPUKAN NIGHT)

On the eve of Nyepi, villages across Bali stage the **Ogoh-Ogoh parade**. Massive, elaborate effigies representing evil spirits are carried through the streets with loud gamelan music, shouting, and torches. At the end of the night, the effigies are burned or dismantled, symbolically destroying negative forces and purifying the surroundings before the Day of Silence.

Location: The junction of Batubelig Street and Kerobokan Street

Time: From 18.00 onwards

Impact: Road closures and limited vehicle access in the area

THE RITUALS

THE DAY OF SILENCE (NYEPI)

Following the intense activity of the previous days, the island observes 24 hours of complete silence beginning at 06.00 on Nyepi Day until 06.00 the following day. The Balinese follow **Catur Brata Penyeopian**, which includes:

Amati Geni – no fire or light

Amati Karya – no work

Amati Lelunganan – no travel

Amati Lelanguan– no entertainment or pleasure

During this day, streets remain empty, flights and boats stop, and daily life pauses. The silence allows for self-reflection, spiritual purification, and restoration of balance for both individuals and the universe.

NGEMBAK GENI

Takes place the day after Nyepi, marking the end of the Day of Silence. Its name literally means “opening the fire” (ngembak= open, geni= fire).

It is a time for reconnecting with family, friends, and neighbors and asking for forgiveness for past mistakes, strengthening social and spiritual bonds.

The day celebrates renewal, harmony, and the return of energy to the community.



NYEPI GUIDELINES

FOR GUESTS AT PEPPERS SEMINYAK

To honor the sanctity of Nyepi and ensure a peaceful experience for all, guests are required to adhere to the following guidelines:

- **Remain within the resort premises at all times**, except in cases of medical emergencies.
- **Walking around the resort is permitted**, but please do so quietly.
- **Noise restrictions apply**: Loud conversations, music, and shouting—even inside the villa—are strictly prohibited.
- **Keep television volume low** to avoid disturbing others.
- **Limited housekeeping services**: Fresh towels and trash collection will be available upon request (dial “0”), but villa cleaning services will not be provided on **19 March 2026**.
- **Television broadcast restrictions**: Regular TV channels will be unavailable, but two special channels—a movie channel and a kids’ channel—will be accessible for entertainment.
- **Main pool usage** is allowed from **06.00 to 17.00** only.
- These measures help maintain the tranquility of Nyepi and ensure a respectful observance of this sacred tradition.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

ATM & BANKING SERVICES

Most ATMs and banking services will be unavailable from 18th March 2026 and will resume operations on 20th March 2026. We recommend withdrawing cash a few days in advance to avoid inconvenience.

For guests checking out on 18 March 2026, particularly those with flights departing after 16.00, we kindly recommend departing Peppers Seminyak at least four hours in advance to allow sufficient travel time.
